2015 has been a rather busy year for the zone with the major contentious issue being the increase to Bowls N.S.W. Affiliation fees and Zone Capitation fees.

In the past this fee was billed directly to individual members, this has been changed to a one bill to each bowling club assessed on the number of registered bowlers as at 31st.May 2015 with a CPI increase each year. The second issue was the amount to be charged to each club. For 2015/2016 this will be \$60.00 for each member as at this date. How the club collects this money is the responsibility of each individual club. At Bateau Bay Bowling Club we intend to raise the money through member's annual fees (e.g. \$80.00 per member made up of \$60.00 State \$17.00 Zone, and a \$3. Administration fee.

As a committee we feel this is the fairest way to cover these costs and compared to other bowling clubs this fee is less than most.

As at the last Zone meeting the makeup of the grade 1 Pennants competition for 2016 had not been finalised and will not be known for some time.

Other than these issues 2015 has progressed as expected.

Selectors AGM Report to Bateau Bay Men's Bowls Club On the 2015 Pennant Season

On behalf of the Selection Committee consisting of Ray Vetter, Denis Baker, Norm Latta, Tony Hegyi and myself, I submit a report on the above season for information.

Trials were commenced much earlier than in previous years with the aim being to allow selectors to observe the abilities of all nominated intended players as much as possible, allowing us to consider grades, positions and apply for re-grading players where necessary.

The observation of many players was curtailed to some extent because of unavailability of several members due to Championship event being allocated on trial days.

Criteria for selection were not necessarily the winning of pennant trial games, but more so on the ability, attitude and consistency of the players.

Difficulties arose in the selection process with approximately 14 players being labelled N6 by State Match Committee (Meaning they could play no lower than grade 6 due to the club winning Grade 6 in 2014). This will not apply in 2016 so there will not necessarily be two grade five sides.

Another major problem was also encountered when some of our higher graded players could not play because of personal reasons; whilst some other club members did not wish to play in the position/ grade they were selected. This was very disappointing.

We had 26 players unavailable on 40 occasions over a 10 game pennant season. This is unsatisfactory from a selector's point of view and unfair to players who commit for the 10 games as some players had to play in different teams for many games.

(General Comments from the Chair – As we have to submit to the Zone by early November the number of sides for the 2014 Pennant Season – The List is in the bowling alcove and I would like any member who has not yet put his name down and intends to play to please do so now.)

GENERAL BUSINESS:-

- (1) Richard Martin raised concerns in regards to the BBBC NO2 Ltd. As there was a change in the Committee that signed it would the new President be placed on the list of directors to replace the outgoing President. Possibility that (He would need to resign)
 - The C.E.O. of Bateau Bay Sports Club addressed this question, and relayed that J.Brain from Canterbury would be available to answer any questions in regards to this subject in the Thursday following the A.G.M. There would be a meeting at Canterbury to vote on 20th.October at 7.00P.M. and an additional meeting on the 1st.November for all Bay Sports Club Members re this amalgamation.
