



We have a new President this year in Kevin Dring, as Col Bray has moved closer to his family in Northern NSW. Congratulations are in order to our very own Tony Hegyi being elected as Deputy President.

Bowls Central Coast has developed a Strategic Plan (which can be viewed on the zone website) this year to try and combat the continuing declining trend of bowls membership, having a 40% drop in zone memberships in the last 10 years.

A successful new recruitment tournament was introduced this year, Hava-go-pairs, with 153 teams entering, which means 153 new people were introduced to our wonderful game, out of which the zone believe they have already secured 35 new bowlers throughout the zone. The best part of that is our very own Jeff Kellie and new up and coming Warren Power won the inaugural event.

Thanks to the efforts of the new Zone Junior Management Team Russell Johnson, David Cameron and Peter Coombes our Under 18's have had their best results in years in the State 7-A-Side at Dubbo in August with our fours (which included our boys Jacob Burns & Caleb Peck) and pairs running 4th in the state and the team finished 6th overall from the 16 zones.

We have also had 3 Zone 15 juniors chosen for the State Squad.

Congratulations is also in order to ToukleyRSL winning a State 4's flag this year, their first ever State Flag.

TREASURERS REPORT

01/09/2015 - 31/07/2016

Once again our club, through our members and sponsors continues to remain in a strong financial position.

This is highlighted by our consistent bowling numbers and their generosity in supporting our raffles.

It is the committee's position to 'give back' as much as is practical to yourselves whilst being prudent with our money. This return to investors continues in the vein of bowling 'free days', raffle prizes (at around 50% of income), rink prizes, pennant allowances and snacks.

We have been successful in obtaining some new sponsors; Adrian's All Inclusive Transport and Brebner and Associates and retaining most of our long time partners (The Palmdale Group, Neu-Solutions and Shelly Beach Mechanical) as well as receiving grants from our owners Wyong Rugby League Club. Thanks to our Secretary – Paul Hannagan for his efforts in this area.

During the past 13 months Wyong have upgraded their accounting and financial systems, unfortunately not without some problems. This system changeover has caused several issues for both us and Wyong. There have been delays with monthly reports, late and incorrect postings which all culminate in a lot of telephone calls and emails and time in trying to resolve these issues. Some are still open. Therefore there difficulties in reporting on separate accounts.

After our recent meeting with Wyong Accounts staff they have implemented a couple of new procedures (a dedicated staff member, and a reporting delivery date) that should lead to better and timelier information between both parties.

We have also been looking at ways to improve our banking, payment and recording methods, and some of those changes started from September 1st.

Once again I thank our members and bowlers for their continued support – both bowling and financially in maintaining the growth of our club – Bateau Bay Men's Bowling Club.

Considerations, Comments, 2017 and Beyond

1.

It was a big step to not field a Grade 1 team this year and although the Grade 2 team didn't have the results we had hoped for, this was a first step that we can build on for 2017. We do have talented Grade 2 and Grade 3 players who have the potential to make a difference in those Grades next year.

2.

A process of approaching a small number of possible Grade 1/2/3 players from other Clubs is a step that will be considered by the Selectors in the coming few months. Four players of Grade 1/2/3 standard added to the players we already have will result in more competitive sides in 2017 in Grade 2 and Grade 3.

- 3.
- Of the 15 games lost in total in Grade 2 and Grade 3 this season 8 (53%) were games lost by less than 10 shots. It is a fine line between winning and losing games with margins that are so close. In particular, Grade 3 would have gone very close to qualifying for the Zone Final had they won most of the 5 close losses they had during the season.
- 4.

The Grade 4 team performed well following on from their efforts in 2015. We made very little change to the 2016 team. Two close losses stood between their 4th place finish and finishing significantly higher in the Grade. The Skips Bill Roberts, Ron Young and Norm Latta have been very good leaders for the squad, both last year and again in 2016.

5.

The Grade 5 team had 9 losses in the season but 5 (56%) of those losses were by less than 10 shots. Although the season was a poor one for this Grade, it could have been much more successful had more of those close results gone their way.

Ryan Wood handled the move from Grade 7 to Grade 5 well. Ryan is a player with considerable potential.

6.

The Grade 6 team had a very slow start, not winning a game until Round 5. But they won 5 of the last 6 games to finish 3rd in their Section.

That team could have been stronger, but it was a very happy group who were competitive all season.

Mark Mitchell (Skip), Lucas Burns (Third) and David Sinclair (Lead/Third) all stood out in their first season in those positions and they must be supported in those roles again in 2017.

7.

Our best performed team was obviously the Grade 7(1)'s.

A side that initially changed in nature, but regrouped and won 7 out of 8 games during the season. The addition of relatively new players to our Club in Steve Potter and Bob Knapman enhanced the side.

The Skips Brian Bush, Les Mackie and Bob Knapman lead their rinks very well. The balance of experienced players and newer players worked well.

The team deserve all the congratulations they received.

8.

The Seven (2) team had a very solid start to the season before finding a string of losses in the second half of the season.

Players such as John Davidson, Peter Starkey, Rob Wagner and Jim Fraser will benefit greatly from this season.

9.

Selector Kevin Russell has offered:

'A Possible Grading Proposal.

Gradings could be dictated by the number of nominated players for nominated Grades (plus 20%).

'The actual Gradings could be determined by the player's ability to play in that Grade and the number of players required for that Grade could be determined by the Selectors at the end of the current season'.

10.

Selector Ian Baker provided, 'I firmly believe that the Two's have to stay, we have the quality in the majority of bowlers already there. If we were able to pick up one or two Grade 1 or Grade 2 players before next season, it could just top off the Two's.

With starting with the Two's we were able to shuffle players down through the grades and on paper the teams looked good but things didn't work out as well as expected. There were changes made to the teams through the season, through unavailability, sickness, etc., which did contribute to the results.

Having said that and looking towards 2017, I feel that all endeavours should be made to strengthen the Two's, with our continued aim to get back into the One's'.

11.

Our collective winning percentage (37%) for all Grades was higher than any of the three preceding seasons.

Had we won just 8 of the 17 (less than 10 shot) losses we would have achieved a 50+% winning season overall.

We're not that far away.







12.

We took the step to move 38 players into lower Grades than they played in 2015.

Most players accepted, and understood, the action and the intention to strengthen sides in lower Grades to start rebuilding our base in Pennants.

Overall the Sixes, Seven (1)'s and Seven (2)'s were all more than competitive in their Grades, winning 57% of their collective games. .

The winning results in our Grade 7 teams were easily the best seen in this Grade for many years.

With the repositioning of players in 2016, there is now room to apply for further regrading's (approximately 12-18 players) to strengthen Grade 4, 5, 6 and 7 in 2017, thus further building up our Pennant base.

13.

We tried a different approach to the start of season with the drill sessions. Thank you to over 80 players who took part in those sessions. Thank you who continued using the drills in their ongoing practice.

14.

We are closer now than we have been for many years to seeing multiple Section winning teams.

Much will depend on any gains in player personnel, minimising any loss of good players and further action to get players to practice and prepare for the 2017 season.

15.

There are unconfirmed reports of players from other Clubs talking about joining Bateau Bay in 2017. We are still a long way from confirming players and really knowing what Grades we submit.

If we have no significant loss of players, we should be considering a similar number of teams in similar Grades for 2017. But that will depend on who we have who want to play.

16.

Selectors **Kevin Russell**, **Norm Latta**, **Jeff Kellie** and **Ian Baker** worked very hard prior to and during the 2016 season. They were all very conscientious, imaginative, selfless, fair and honest in their considerations. They worked together as a team and more than once stood up to make tough decisions and stand by them.

I very much hope they all make themselves available once again for the 2017 season. The rebuilding job is not yet finished!









17.

Thank you Michael Peck, Ken Studdert, Ian Baker and Ray Peck for your help and support with the pre-season training drills.

Thank you lan Baker for your work in completing related Zone paperwork in such a competent manner.

Thank you Jeff Kellie for your co-ordination and hard work with the Thursday training evenings – we can build on those next year.

Thank you Team Managers and Umpires, your support is greatly appreciated.

Thank you the Reserve players who responded each time we were in need of players, your contribution to Pennants was something we couldn't survive without.

Thank you Pat Cummins and Ray Vetter for your advice and support.
